The number-one slot is an automatic entry to the games (so that we support our philosophy of having all-state representation).

CCGS Ruby Miller Scholarship

Purpose: Colorado Coaches of Girls Sports (CCGS) wishes to recognize one or more outstanding female athletes who are graduating high-school seniors and who plan to go into the coaching of girls' sports.

Scholarship Award: One to four awards of \$1,000 each will be presented at the All-State Basketball Games Banquet each year in March.

Scholarship Procedure: Nominations are to be submitted on the official CCGS entry form. Copies may be made for distribution to qualified applicants. An **official transcript** (including first semester of the senior year) and **two letters of recommendation** (only one of which may be written by a coach) must accompany the application. Decisions of the scholarship committee are final.

Applicant Requirements:

- 1. Applicant must plan a career in the coaching of girls' sports.
- 2. Applicant must be a graduating high-school senior with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 after the first semester of her senior year.
- **3.** Applicant must be a girl who has competed in sanctioned CHSAA sport(s) and is a resident of Colorado.
- 4. Applicant must plan to attend an accredited college or university.
- 5. Applicant must submit completed application by February 12 in the calendar year of the award.

2018 Helen McCall Coach of the Year Ron Rossi, Holy Family

Ron Rossi from Holy Family HS is the 2018 CCGS Helen McCall Coach of the Year. Coach Rossi, an athlete himself, lettered in basketball (2 yrs.), tennis (3 yrs.), and gymnastics (3 yrs.) at Arvada West HS. He then went on to attend Colorado College where he lettered in basketball (4 yrs.) and diving (3 yrs.).

A math major, Ron secured a teaching job in Jefferson County. He taught math at Arvada West HS for two stints ('71-'76 and '93-'04) and taught math at Lakewood HS from '76-'93 in the interim. While teaching in Jefferson County, Coach Rossi coached a variety of sports. He was the varsity gymnastics coach from '71 – '74 and the assistant boys' basketball coach from '71-'76 at Arvada HS. Ron also was the head girls' and boys' tennis coach at both Arvada and Lakewood from '71 – 2004. While teaching at Lakewood, he was also the varsity boys' basketball coach from '76-'93. Softball was finally sanctioned by CHSAA and who else but Ron Rossi took over as varsity softball coach for Arvada from '97-'04.

In 2004, Holy Family HS lured Coach Rossi away from Jefferson County, and that is where he has been ever since. Coach Rossi teaches math and Lifetime Fitness at Holy Family along with his coaching duties. At Holy Family Coach Rossi has built a dynasty. His girls' basketball teams have won six 3A state championships, had one Final 4 appearance, one Elite 8 appearance, and has had two teams in the Sweet 16. His Holy Family teams have won 10 consecutive league championships. He has had 15 players go on to play at the collegiate level and has had 7 players or assistant coaches go on to become varsity basketball coaches. Overall, his combined Lakewood boys' and Holy Family girls' basketball record is 482-288 with the Holy Family girls racking up a 312-73 win/loss record.

Coach Rossi has supported his athletes and other athletes from around the state by participating in basketball camps or clinics for 47 years. He was the YMCA Basketball Camp Director for 5 years and has worked with the Gold Crown Foundation as basketball camp director for 32 years.

Obviously, a winner, Ron Rossi has garnered many awards. In Jefferson County he was named Coach of the Year in three different sports: boys' basketball, tennis, and softball. Other awards include Tri-Valley Basketball Coach of the Year in '16 & '18; Metro League Basketball Coach of the Year five times; Colorado 3A Basketball Coach of the Year in '08, '11, '13, & '14; and he was the All-Colorado Girls' Basketball Coach of the Year in 2008.

CCGS appreciates the dedication Ron has shown supporting both his softball players and basketball players. He has coached in the CCGS All-State Softball and Basketball Games. He continues to support his players at the CCGS All-State selection meetings. Ron is enthusiastic and committed to the success of female athletes!
