Speaking of the Pros and Cons, many of our younger team sport coaches may not have thought a thing about a Team Scores. They just assumed it should be. Not so quick. Back in the day when CHSAA was determining whether or not sanction team sports, they thought it might be best is we didn't keep score. They also thought that schools should divide up their players and play together... what a nice girly thing to do! So one team might have Ranum, Westminster, and St. Mary's players all on the "same team." Their opponent might have been Northglenn, Brighton, and Englewood. The coaches kept the score of their players to determine who won the game and have a single game winner, for example Northglenn might have won the game because their players scored the most points of all of the players. Can you believe that?! Looking back, Colorado girl's sports has a dicey history and "We Have Come A Long Way Baby"!

2019 CCGS Hall of Fame Inductee, Leslie Moore, Denver Public Schools

Leslie Moore was a fixture at DPS for almost 40 years as a teacher, coach, district supervisor, director of girls athletics and district athletic director. Moore, a Colorado native, graduated from Thomas Jefferson HS and earned her bachelor's and master's degrees from Western State College in Gunnison. She began her career as a teacher and a coach later moving into administration. Moore concluded her career in 2008 after 10 years as district athletic director and served as the district's Title IX coordinator.

During her time as district athletic director, Moore worked with bond committees and contractors to fund and install artificial turf fields at each high school and to build swimming pools at schools across the district. She worked with Denver Parks & Rec to build the first all-city softball facility for females. Moore was the first assignor to utilize female officials for boys basketball games and led the state in introducing three-person officiating crews for basketball.

Moore made significant contributions at the state level contributing to the Colorado Athletic Directors Assoc. and CHSAA. One of the first post-Title IX female athletic administrators, Moore served on the CADA Board from 1990-2011 and served as the treasurer for 16 yrs. She was chair of the Finance Committee & a member of the CADA Planning Committee.

Upon being elected to the CHSAA Executive Committee in 1994, Moore became the first woman in 75 yrs. to be chosen president in '96. She later served another term on the Executive committee ('02-'05). She served on the CHSAA state tournament and seeding committees in track, basketball, softball, volleyball, tennis, and gymnastics, while hosting hundreds of regional & state playoff games. She was appointed to the CHSAA Volleyball and Gymnastics Committees and was a track official for 10 years. Moore was a Board member of the Girls in Golf Program for 16 years.

Nationally, Moore was a member of the NIAAA Board of Directors ('04-'07) and served on the NIAAA Credentials Committee for six yrs., including one yr. as the chair. She also chaired the Operations Subcommittee for the third NIAAA Strategic Plan Committee '08-'09. In 2010, Moore was inducted into the DPS Hall of Fame and the CHSAA Hall of Fame. She was Colorado Athletic Director of the Year in '96, NIAAA State Award of Merit in '97, Sportswomen of Colorado Contribution to Sport Award in '98, NFHS Citation in '01, Kurby Lyle CADA Service Award in '02, Athletic Director of the Year by CHSAA in '03, CCGS Helen McCall Award winner in '05, Dave Sanders Award winner in '05, and in '16 was inducted into the NIAAA Hall of Fame.

Leslie Moore was an original member of the Colorado Women's Coaches Association (CCGS) and has been an active role model for many girls and women in Colorado.

CCGS Ruby Miller Scholarship

Purpose: Colorado Coaches of Girls Sports (CCGS) wishes to recognize one or more outstanding female athletes who are graduating high-school seniors and who plan to go into the coaching of girls' sports.

Scholarship Award: One to four awards of \$1,000 each will be presented at the All-State Basketball Games Banquet each year in March.

Scholarship Procedure: Nominations are to be submitted on the official CCGS entry form. Copies may be made for distribution to qualified applicants. An **official transcript** (including first semester of the senior year) and **two letters of recommendation** (only one of which may be written by a coach) must accompany the application. Decisions of the scholarship committee are final.

Applicant Requirements:

- 1. Applicant must plan a career in the coaching of girls' sports.
- 2. Applicant must be a graduating high-school senior with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 after the first semester of her senior year.
- **3.** Applicant must be a girl who has competed in sanctioned CHSAA sport(s) and is a resident of Colorado.
- **4.** Applicant must plan to attend an accredited college or university.
- **5.** Applicant must submit completed application by February 12 in the calendar year of the award.

COPIES OF BOTH PAGES (SIDES) MAY BE MADE FOR DISTRIBUTION TO QUALIFIED ATHLETES. BE SURE TO COPY BOTH PAGES (SIDES) AND READ BOTH PAGES (SIDES) CAREFULLY.

APPLICATION, TWO LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION, AND OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT MUST BE RECEIVED <u>AS A PACKET</u> BY CCGS BY FEBRUARY 12 OF THE YEAR OF THE AWARD.
